

Several grant programs on various school safety topics, including student mental health and targeted violence prevention, have recently opened application periods.

The grant programs listed below cover a range of school security and safety issues.

Federal Opportunities

STOP (Students Teachers Officers Preventing) School Violence Program

Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) **Deadline:** June 12, 2024

The STOP School Violence Program is designed to improve school safety by providing students, teachers, and staff with the tools they need to recognize, respond quickly to, and prevent acts of violence.

School Emergency Response to Violence (Project SERV)

Department of Education | Office of Elementary & Secondary Education **Deadline:** Ongoing Opportunity

Project SERV funds short-term education-related services for local educational agencies (LEAs) and institutions of higher education (IHEs) to help them recover from a violent or traumatic event in which disruption in the learning environment occurs.

State Opportunities

Most state education departments* offer school safety program grants, which often fund school safety technologies:
